The Catholic Conference of Illinois (CCI) was created in 1969 to be the public policy voice of the bishops and the Church. CCI interacts with the state legislature, the Governor's office and all elements of state government to promote and defend the interests of the Church.

CCI is well known within the halls of government, but outside of the Capitol building, our public profile is low. Few lay Catholics realize they have a representative - a voice - in what goes on in state government.

The bishops of Illinois and CCI want to remedy this situation. We want parishioners to know that CCI exists as an active and informational service to the Church and her followers.

To increase awareness of CCI and what is going on at the state and federal levels, we are creating the Illinois Catholic Advocacy Network, or I-CAN.
