## **HOUSE BILL 4126: IMPROVMENTS TO INVEST IN KIDS**

House Bill 4126 makes two changes to the Invest in Kids tax credit scholarship program: a superpriority designation and a path for more flexible scholarship amounts.

## **SUPER-PRIORITY**

- First, and most important, the bill grants first-priority status to scholarship applicants who are current scholarship holders and remain eligible. In effect, this creates a "super priority" status for those students already in the program. This change is important to the program, the school, and most importantly, the student.
  - o "Super-priority status" provides security to student scholarship holders by ensuring they may continue to attend the school they chose when first entering the program.
  - By granting these students a practical guarantee to continue in the program, schools then have expanded opportunity to ensure the student's academic growth and maintain a consistent and reliable curriculum throughout grade levels.
  - For Scholarship Granting Organizations, the application process will become streamlined, easier to administer, and will have the effect of making it easier for all families to access and submit applications.

## **PARTIAL-SCHOLARSHIPS**

- Second, the bill allows participating schools to set an alternative scholarship amount for applicants whose income is below 185% of federal poverty level as long as it does not exceed the necessary cost and fees of attendance at that school.
  - O The existing law sets the scholarship amounts for applicants in this income group at 100% of necessary costs and fees. This change would allow a school to lower that amount if conditions warranted.
  - o No school will be required to set an alternative amount.
  - We hope this change could lead to the expansion of available scholarships for which there is great demand – by more accurately matching available scholarship dollars with the needs of applying families.
